

# Clothing and Equipment a Camper should bring to Camp

Clothing *	Linens
□ 7-8 T-shirts	□ 1 sleeping bag
□ 2-3 long sleeve shirts	□ 1 pillow
□ 2 or 3 sweatshirts / sweaters	□ 1-2 pillowcases
□ 2 or 3 pairs shorts	□ 3 beach towels
□ 2 or 3 pairs long pants / jeans	□ 1 throw size campfire blanket (approx. 48" x 60")
□ 6 to 8 pairs underwear	□ 1 fitted bedsheet (single)
□ 6 to 8 pairs socks	Toiletries & Misc. **
□ 3 pairs warm pyjamas	□ 1 toothpaste & toothbrush
□ 2 swimsuits	□ 1-2 bottles of sunscreen
$\Box$ 1 hat / cap for the sun	□ 1 bottle of bug repellant
□ 1 light jacket or shell	□ soap & shampoo
□ 1 raincoat	□ writing materials
□ 2 pairs sport shoes	□ 1-2 flashlights / headlamp
□ 1 pair of crocs or sandals	□ 1 small penknife for carving (11 years & older only!)
□ 1 pair rubber rain boots	□ 2 white bandanas (for games)
Returning Campers	□ 2 red bandanas (for games)
□ Feather Shield	□ 1 water bottle
Essential for 3-10 day canoe trips (Boys 10	)-16 yrs)
□ 2 pairs of canvas or nylon running shoes (These will go through a lot. Send old shoes or inexpensive ones.)	□ 1-2 heavy duty socks
□ 1 water bottle	□ Rugged rain suit (jacket & pants)
□ 1 lifejacket (Optional)	□ Fox 40 whistle (LITs only)
* You may be guided by the fact that the laundry goes	out once a week and returns in two or three days.

#### **Miscellaneous Sports & Recreational Equipment (Optional)**

The Camp has an ample supply of equipment for most Camp activities. However, here is a list of items, which could be useful if a camper already owns them.

#### PACKING DOS AND DON'TS

#### Don't pack expensive clothes & equipment

Storage is in a tent and there are up to 200 campers at the camp at any one time. Camp property is very large, and items may be lost or damaged.

### Do pack all items in a watertight trunk

Dimensions: H 13" (max) W 30"- 36" D 15"- 24"

Because there is limited space in our tents it is ideal to pack your campers clothing in a trunk that fits under their cot. Waterproof sports/duffle bag or a plastic/rubber container can also be used instead of a trunk. Try to limit your camper to 2 pieces of luggage (i.e. trunk and backpack)

## **<u>Don't</u>** pack electronics of any kind for use at camp

We are Technology Free at camp and below are examples of what <u>NOT</u> to send to camp!

<u>cell phones</u> tablets— computers e-readers speakers digital cameras

## Do label all your camper's clothes

It is imperative to have your son's full first and last name on everything in this checklist. It's a good idea to tape a copy of this list in his trunk as it will help him and his counsellor when packing at the end of his session.

# Don't pack any food items (including candy or gum)

We live in tents in the woods therefor we need to avoid attracting animals into the tent line. Please also refrain from sending care packages with food or candy.
